serve as an indicator for the overall health of Oregon's statewide ecosystems; and

**WHEREAS:** Each year in the U.S. more than 200 people are killed in wildlife-vehicle collisions,

26,000 are injured and more than 1.5 million animals are hit on roads; and

WHEREAS: The average cost of property damage from these collisions is over \$1 billion, and the total

cost to society annually is \$8.4 billion; and

**WHEREAS:** The success of wildlife movement and survival in Oregon remains dependent upon

continued public education and increased understanding of the essential role migration

corridors play in wildlife movement; and

WHEREAS: Wildlife watching is one of the most popular outdoor recreational activities for tourists in

Oregon.

**THEREFORE**: I, John A. Kitzhaber, M.D., Governor of the State of Oregon, hereby proclaim
